

UTM INTRAMURALS – OPEN SINGLES BADMINTON

RULES AND REGULATIONS

All Open Singles Badminton rules are set out by Badminton Canada with the following exceptions:

NUMBER OF PLAYERS

- Games may begin with 1 player per team
 - All teams will have a maximum roster size of 1 player

DEFAULTS

- > Games will start on time as scheduled
- For every minute that a player is late their opponent will be given 2 points towards their total score in the first set
- If a team does not show by 10 minutes past the scheduled time, the team will lose by default
 The default score will be records as 3-0 (21-0, 21-0, 21-0)

EQUIPMENT AND UNIFORMS

- > All scheduled games will receive 2 birdie to play
- All players must wear proper athletic attire (no jeans or boots) and non-marking shoes must be worn
- > Face masks are welcomed and encouraged during check-in and during physical play
- Players are required to bring their own racquets or sign out racquet from the RAWC Control Desk
 - PLEASE NOTE: There are limited amount of racquets available to be signed out

LENGTH OF GAMES AND SCORING SYSTEM

- > All matches will consist of a best 3 out of 5 set game or best score after 50 minutes
- > Matches will be played to 21 points
 - Players must win by 2 points or first to receive 25 points
- If a set cannot be completed in the time given, a combined total of 15 points must be scored in the current set in order for the set to count
 - I.E. Player 1 has 10 points & Player 2 has 8 points the set will count and Player 1 will be awarded the win *(Player 1 Points + Player 2 Points = must equal 15 points or more)*
- > The league runs through a point system:

- \circ WIN = 3 points
- \circ TIE = 1 points
- \circ LOSS = 0 point
- DEFAULT = -1 point

OFFICIALS


Badminton is a self-officiated sport

ELIGIBILITY

- Players (including late players) must check-in on the game sheet before every game in order to participate
- > No spectators are allowed on team benches
- > For eligibility rules, please refer to the UTM Intramurals Student Handbook

START OF MATCH & PLAY

- Players will compete in singles competition in a standard badminton match, following Badminton Canada rules
- All Badminton matches will be played on a standard singles badminton court in the Recreation, Athletics & Wellness Centre
- During service, the birdie must make contact with the racquet below the waist to be a legal serve
- Players will underhand serve the birdie cross court within the single's lines on the court, and alternate striking the birdie over the net until one player is unable to return a shot, or the birdie lands outside the court/into the net
- > A point is awarded to the player who hit the winning shot of the rally



Serves are to be taken according to the score – when participants score is even, they serve from the right side of the court, when participant score is odd, they will serve from the left

TIME OUTS

- > Teams are allowed one 30-second timeout per set (either in set 1 or set 2).
- > Time-outs cannot be used in the third, fourth or fifth set

SUBSTUTIONS, FOULS & EJECTIONS

- > No substitutions will be allowed in badminton singles match
- > Verbal abuse of the other players, teammate or game manger will not be tolerated

Revised June 2023

- Participants who display unsportsmanlike behavior will be followed up with the UTM Intramurals Administration Staff
- > Fighting, verbal slurs and excessive verbal abuse will **not** be tolerated
- An ejection will result in an appearance before the administration staff. NOTE: the <u>minimum</u> penalty for fighting is a <u>minimum</u> one-year suspension

TIE BREAKING RULE & PLAYOFFS

- > There are no time limits during the playoff matches
- > All playoff will be best of 5 sets and sets are played to 21 points
 - Players must win by 2 points or first to receive 25 points
