COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course will examine key works of Nineteenth Century American Literature, including major works by Charles Brockden Brown, Catharine Maria Sedgwick, Washington Irving, Edgar Allan Poe, Nathaniel Hawthorne; Ralph Waldo Emerson; Herman Melville; Henry James; Harriet Jacobs; Sarah Winnemucca Hopkins; Stephen Crane, and Kate Chopin. Representative poetry of the Nineteenth Century will also be studied.

REQUIRED READING: Brown: Wieland, or the Transformation (1798); Irving: "Rip Van Winkle" and "The Legend of Sleepy Hollow" (1819); Sedgwick: A New England Tale (1822); Emerson: Nature (1836); Poe: The Narrative of Arthur Gordon Pym (1838); Melville: Moby Dick (1851); Hawthorne: The Blithedale Romance (1852); Jacobs: Incidents in the Life of a Slave Girl (1861); Winnemucca Hopkins: Life Among the Paiutes: Their Wrongs and Claims (1883); Henry James: The Turn of the Screw, Stephen Crane: Maggie: A Girl of the Streets (1893); Kate Chopin: The Awakening (1899); Mark Twain: The Mysterious Stranger and Other Stories.

FIRST THREE TEXTS/AUTHORS TO BE STUDIED: Brown, Irving, Sedgwick.
