Course title: Effective Writing

Course Description: This course is designed to enhance students' skills in writing expository and persuasive prose. While the concepts of effective writing will be discussed and models of effective writing studied, the course's primary goal is to afford students practice in the writing process's various stages, from pre-writing through writing to revision. Gaining familiarity with the principles of clarity and coherence will help students writing in various forms and contexts, but this course will focus on academic writing. *Please note that this course does not meet the needs of students primarily seeking to develop English-language proficiency.*
