

From the Director ...

It was more than 50 years ago when I saw my first melodrama. I was visiting my grandmother in Cobourg and the actors in the visiting theatre company held a parade down the main street – complete with horse-drawn wagon and the company dressed in full costume. A parade of actors was definitely out of the ordinary for me, and the publicity stunt worked its charm. My grandmother and I simply had to see the melodrama...and I was hooked.

Melodramas have tidy moral lessons, and characters are types rather than fully-rounded entities. There is a clear structure to the plot line, beginning with a villain who poses a threat, a hero who escapes the threat and/or rescues the sweet young heroine, and events generally have happy endings. Characters live in a world of heightened emotion, surrounded by stock characters, and there is always a clear delineation of good and evil.

As a result, melodrama is easy to mock as being irrelevant to modern thinking. Perhaps it is because we live in a far more complex world where clear moral absolutes no longer go unchallenged. Perhaps it is because we view emotionalism with great skepticism. Or perhaps it's because we are imagining what can better be described as melodramatic farce.

The idea of using music to underscore the emotional content of a scene has been with us for centuries. In the last few decades, it has branched out to new audiences in the world of film beginning with silent movies – accompanied by live organ or piano music – and progressing through radio, television and animation to inhabit all aspects of modern entertainment. It is ironic that the Marks family folded after four-plus decades when the new medium of film drew its audience base away from live theatre, because the world of film constantly uses music to heighten the emotion in the same manner as melodramatic theatre.

When the idea was first proposed to bring the story of the Marks family to life, I was intrigued by the concept. First, we could tell the story of a family who – although relatively unsung today - made a major, successful contribution to the history of theatre in Ontario and beyond. Second, we could incorporate vignettes from the world of vaudeville and melodrama which provides the actors with interesting studies in style. Third, the material was well suited to showcase the talents of this particular third-year class because, in addition to acting and singing, this project offered them a chance to research and write about real-life characters.

Mind you, we make no claim to being historically accurate. The eldest Marks brother, R.W., was born in 1855 and the youngest, Ernie, in 1879 – twenty-four years apart. If you trace who went where, who married whom and when, all nine Marks offspring and their spouses could not possibly appear in the scenes we've created. Consider, then, that the play brings to life some of the stories from their past but – as with all theatre – we've tweaked them to make them theatrically effective for this group of actors with their particular skills and interests, in this space, within a limited period of time and money.

As often happens, though, we had far too many ideas we wanted to bring to life on stage and too little time and resources to do justice to them all. Alas, many really interesting ideas remain on the cutting room floor. But we hope you enjoy today's presentation of the fascinating Canadian Kings of Repertoire.

About the Author ...

English-born Michael Taylor was editor of the *Perth Courier* for several years and had a deep interest in the history of this area. He had a newsman's feel for a special story and researched his subject matter thoroughly. His progress was sporadic and spanned several years, but personal circumstances meant he had to leave the Perth area before the book was finalized. Assisted by the late Doug McNichol, then curator of the Perth Museum, and Barry Penhale, publisher, the legacy of the seven brawny farm boys from Christie Lake has its unique place in Canadian entertainment history.

From the Music Director ...

Working on this production has involved research through material from the period of the Marks Company productions – roughly 1875 to the 1920s. Many of the composers we found are legendary, but some are now mostly forgotten.

Names include: Irving Berlin, Stephen Foster, Jerome Kern, Charles K, Harris, Thomas H. Bayley, Harry Von Tilzer, George Evans, Charles B. Lawler, H.W. Petrie, Fred Fisher, and Harry Kennedy.

Their melodies have been arranged into parlour songs, Barbershop quartets, and counterpoint duets -- and some incidental humming with an Irish lilt. As with every annual collective at Theatre Erindale, we worked on many more songs than we had time to include in the show. In fact, at the time these notes went to press, songs were still being added, cut, and reconsidered over and over again. But that is the process of creating a collective production.

I hope you recognize many of these songs from your younger days, and they bring a smile to your face.





THE MARKS BROTHERS

The Marks Brothers were seven remarkable farm boys from Christie Lake in Eastern Ontario (near Perth), who, together with the women who became their stars and sometimes their wives, operated some of the continent's most successful theatrical touring companies from the 1870s to the 1920s. From a rough and ready start, they grew to the point of splitting into as many as four separate companies at a time, often including variety, dime museums, comedy, and melodrama in the same operation, and earning fame for the classiness of their costumes and sets. Although they were excluded from the major cities by the New York and London Syndicates that dominated turn-of-the-century show business, the Marks Brothers filled the entertainment void in smaller centres with top flight productions, and eventually played to well over 8,000,000 people.

"...the most remarkable theatrical family in Canadian history. The dazzling Marks Brothers were the greatest impresario-performers of our small town stage in the era before the nickelodeon." (Maclean's Magazine, 1958)

"The announcement of that Marks Brothers troupe with 'an entire change of program nightly' was electrical in its effects upon almost everybody. It marked the end of dull times; it was something to look forward to with all the eagerness of a child counting the days to Christmas." (*Rambling Round*, 1932)

Direction and Design. . .



RON CAMERON-LEWIS, Director

Mr. Cameron-Lewis has taught acting for Sheridan College for over three decades, and has been involved in the Theatre and Drama Studies program at UTM since its inception. This is the seventh production he has directed for Theatre Erindale. In addition, he worked as dramaturge with Director Heinar Pillar on *Love's Labour's Lost* in 2005.

Ron directed last season's highly acclaimed *Thirteen Hands* which will be remounted on February 23 and 24, 2007, at UTM's Multimedia Studio Theatre space in the CCIT building. It will subsequently be presented at Hart House Theatre on March 8, 9 and 10, 2007.

Most notably, Mr. Cameron-Lewis has created several original collective productions for Theatre Erindale. He co-directed *The Golden Ass* in 2003 with Dia Frid. Prior to that, he adapted and directed *The Loyalist Project* - covering 250 years of Canadian history – with material drawn from books written by his forefathers. He also created *Lovers in Dangerous Times* in 1998 and, with the assistance of Dia Frid, adapted Barry Broadfoot's *Six War Years* for the 1995/96 season. A Shakespearean enthusiast, Mr. Cameron-Lewis's production of *The Comedy of Errors* was presented as part of the 2000/01 Theatre Erindale season.

Mr. Cameron-Lewis's textbook on acting technique, *Acting Skills for Life*, is in its third printing with the Dundurn Group. A highly respected adjudicator, he has critiqued over 2,000 high-school and community theatre productions throughout Ontario and the USA at State, Regional and National levels. In addition, he has worked at the Charlottetown Festival, Lighthouse Festival Theatre, Huron Country Playhouse, the Arts & Culture Centre in St. John's, over the years.

Mr. Cameron-Lewis graduated as a history major from the University of Western Ontario, and went on to train in theatre at the Banff School of Fine Arts, the Guildhall School of Music and Drama in London (England) and the University of London, U.K.

In 2004 Mr. Cameron-Lewis was awarded the Maggie Bassett Award by Theatre Ontario in recognition of his sustained contribution to the development of theatre in Ontario.

PATRICK YOUNG, Artistic Director

Patrick graduated in English from Victoria College, University of Toronto, trained in Theatre on a graduate scholarship at Indiana University, and was soon a well-known actor across Canada. His Toronto credits included the record-breaking hits Flicks, The Relapse, and the original production of Automatic Pilot, as well as Chinchilla and the last national tour of Spring Thaw. Elsewhere the range included Misalliance in Boston, Uncle Vanya and Tobacco Road in Indiana, Windsor in Charlottetown, Dames at Sea in Winnipeg, Hav Fever across BC and Scapin across Ontario, plus guest starring on such TV series as The Great Detective and Night Heat. During the 1980s, he branched into playwriting, directing, and teaching. He is the author of the award-winning biographical plays "Winnie" (also filmed for television). Aimee!, and Abigail. or The Gold Medal, plus numerous industrial shows. He has held the posts of Artistic Director of Dalhousie Theatre Productions in Halifax. Director/Dramaturge of the Music Theatre Writers' Colony at the Muskoka Festival, and Associate Director/Playwright in Residence at the Lighthouse Festival Theatre. Teaching includes Waterloo, Dalhousie, George Brown, Humber, and Gaya College in Malaysia. He is the founding Artistic Director of Theatre Erindale and the founding Sheridan Coordinator of the Theatre and Drama Studies Program (which is now in its sixteenth year). For Theatre
