The Robert Gillespie Academic Skills Centre provides a range of individual consultations, workshops, and programs to help students identify and develop the academic skills they need for success.



## Tips

Here are a few tips that you might find helpful to ensure you maintain academic integrity in your academic work:

- Plan ahead to avoid completing work at the last minute.
- Consult your syllabus. Most have details on plagiarism and what instructors expect from you.
- Do not share you answers or assignments on social media platforms.
- Be careful when participating in group chats! Leave the chatroom before a test or examination begins to avoid committing an academic offence.
- Visit <u>the UTM Library</u> for assistance with referencing, research, and writing. You can also visit the <u>Old</u> <u>Exams Repository</u> to assist you with studying for exams or tests!
