Description: The Department of Anthropology at the University of Toronto Mississauga invites applications for a tenure-stream appointment in Biological Anthropology with a focus on Health, at the rank of Assistant Professor, beginning July 1, 2015.

We seek a biological anthropologist with an established research program focused on health. Relevant specialties may include human physiology, growth and development (including childhood and aging), human diversity, nutrition, epidemiology, public health and global health (including environmental health). The successful candidate will complement existing faculty strengths, and will benefit from proposed new synergies in social and biological aspects of health with faculty in Geography, Sociology, Women & Gender Studies, Biology, and other programs at UTM. At the graduate level, the new hire will participate in the Medical Anthropology as well as the Evolutionary Anthropology streams. Preference will be given to candidates who have demonstrated excellence in research and teaching, with an ability to teach courses at the undergraduate and graduate levels. The ability to teach lecture or practical courses relating to lab methods in biological anthropology and/or the development of thought in biological anthropology may be an asset.

The University of Toronto Mississauga has an interdisciplinary commitment, a multicultural student body, and a modern and spacious campus. The successful candidate will be expected to develop an externally funded and internationally recognized research program, pursue excellence in teaching in the UTM Anthropology undergraduate program, and actively participate in the tri-campus Anthropology Graduate program at the University of Toronto. Candidates should have a Ph.D. by date of appointment (or soon thereafter).

Salary to be commensurate with qualifications and experience.
