

Reporting Options

Reportable incidents of violence against women at UTM include:

- physical abuse
- sexual abuse
- emotional and verbal abuse
- threats to your safety, including damage to your property
- criminal harassment/stalking
- online harassment, threats and violence
- financial abuse

When you report an incident to the Campus Police Services, there are several reporting options that you can use. The Campus Police Services can be contacted at 905-828-5200 for more information and advice on these reporting options.

- **Non-emergency and/or property-related incidents.** Use the Campus Police Services web site to make an online report: this is for incidents that are not emergencies or are property-related only <http://www.utm.utoronto.ca/campus-police/line-reporting>
- **Request assistance, information and referral.** You can request assistance, information or referrals from Campus Police Services. Please note that these requests do not result in a written report or further action by Campus Police Services. If you require further action or a report, consider the following options, below
- **File a report for information only.** This means that a report is filed with the Campus Police Services, but no further action will be taken unless there is further contact with, worrying behaviour or other inappropriate action by the other person
- **File a report and request an investigation, with no charges.** You can file a report requesting a Campus Police Services investigation but ask that no charges be laid against the other person
- **File a report and request an investigation,** with possibility that Campus Police Services will initiate criminal charges, student code of conduct proceedings, a trespass ban or other legal action being taken as a result

Contacting the Campus Police Services or reporting an incident will not be reflected on your academic record, grade reports or any other academic documentation.
