



CUE Research Fund – 2022

Description: The Centre for Urban Environments funds multiple research projects through the CUE Research Fund. The maximum award per project is \$2,000 and proposals can be submitted by any graduate student or post-doctoral fellow based at UTM. Supervisors must confirm support for the proposal by way of a separate email to cue@utoronto.ca. Work can be proposed on any topic related to urban environments, regardless of discipline and the awarding of proposals will be spread equally across the humanities, social and natural sciences. Cross-disciplinary proposals that bridge disciplines are particularly encouraged.

To apply for a CUE Research Fund grant, please provide a 1-page description of the proposed project. The project description should clearly state: i) the project title, ii) the research objective or questions; iii) sufficient background that explains why the project is important, novel and timely; iv) methodology or a description of how the objectives will be achieved; and v) a concise timeline of the proposed project, indicating what will be achieved within one year of receiving funding. On a second page, please provide a concise (100 word) budget justification. The budget justification should describe the total project costs and how the requested funds will be used including cost estimates. Please write for a general audience and avoid jargon or discipline specific terms. The one page proposal should be single-spaced, 12 point font with 2.5cm margins. References are optional and can be provided on a separate page, corresponding to numbered superscripts in the main text.

Proposals will be evaluated based on the following criteria: 1) Clarity of the research objective/question (20%); 2) importance and novelty of proposed project (20%); 3) feasibility of the project in the proposed timeline (20%); 4) The fit of the proposed project with CUE's vision and mission (see www.urbanenvironment.ca) (15%), 5) cross-disciplinary nature of proposal (10%); and 6) budget justification (15%).

Deadline: February 24, 2022. Results will be conveyed to applicants by late March, 2022. Please submit all proposals to cue@utoronto.ca.

Conditions of funding: Any publications that stem from the CUE Research Fund must acknowledge funding in the publication, report or presentation, and list the “Centre for Urban Environments, University of Toronto Mississauga” as an affiliation. A short report (ca. 300 words) must be submitted within one year of receiving funding, describing progress on the project. All applicants and their supervisors must be members of CUE, which can be requested by emailing cue@utoronto.ca and marc.johnson@utoronto.ca.

Eligible expenses: Funds can be used for most direct research costs. Travel for field work, consumable supplies, minor pieces of equipment and undergraduate research assistant wages are examples of eligible costs. Ineligible expenses include funds for attending conferences, workshops and graduate student stipends. Funds should not be used for the purchase of large pieces of equipment or publication charges.
