ABOUT

The Blackwood Gallery is a contemporary art gallery situated on the University of Toronto Mississauga campus. The Blackwood presents curated exhibitions featuring the work of local, national, and international professional artists in its three spaces: the Blackwood Gallery in room 140 of the Kaneff Centre on Inner Circle Road; the e|gallery on the ground floor of the Communication, Culture, and Information Technology Building (CCT); and the Bernie Miller Lightbox on the exterior of the William Davis Building. The Blackwood also hosts a variety of events throughout the year for students and the general public, and works closely with many on-campus programs to provide opportunities for students both in and outside of the classroom. Admission to the Blackwood Gallery is free.

MANDATE

The Blackwood Gallery is a catalyst for current debates, and a laboratory for contemporary artistic and curatorial experiments. Through its activities, it aims to disturb preconceptions, foster discussion, and engage the intellect as well as the senses. Its prime objectives are to advance the knowledge and appreciation of contemporary art through exhibitions, publications, and events; address contemporary issues in an interdisciplinary manner; function as an education resource for academic programs within the university and for a wider audience; and maintain and develop the university's art collection for the enjoyment and education of the public.



EXHIBITIONS AND PROGRAMS

The Blackwood presents five to six exhibitions each year, including the Art and Art History Graduating Exhibitions and a Master of Visual Studies– Curatorial Studies Graduating Exhibition. In addition to its exhibition schedule, the Blackwood presents a number of special programs, including publications, public lectures, performances, off-site exhibitions, artist residencies, symposia, conferences, and workshops.
