From the Director ...

Is this play based on fact or fiction? Why are there so many questions left unanswered in this play? Since the publication of the novel, there have been many interpretations written about what might have really occurred at the Picnic at Hanging Rock on Valentine's Day 1900. None of the explanations, under careful scrutiny, stand up to reason. Ultimately, we need to look beyond the unsolved crime. We don't have the answers, and there are no comforting conclusions. We have to let go of these unanswerable questions, or we find ourselves trapped in a world of one-dimensional characters and lost in endless exposition. The play can trap its actors like Hanging Rock forever keeps its secrets. We must ask different questions to find a more satisfying and creative expression of the play; we have to find larger truths about these characters, and dare to invent a subtext that is bold. We have to keep up the pace and move with clarity through difficult passages and transitions, which, at times, hang dangerously on a precipice. We must do all of this, or like the girls of our story, our play is sacrificed to a senseless death. It was no small challenge for the actors to find truth and authenticity in this play.

Perhaps that is why the experience of directing this play was so satisfying for me. I've had the privilege of directing a group of brave and talented young actors who have worked hard to bring this play to life. They are asking the greater questions of the play -- questions like: What happens to us both as individuals and as a community when we cannot find answers to tragic events in our lives that shake us to the very core? Why do some characters rise above great loss and why do some characters fall from great heights? Why do we as a society sacrifice women? How do we come to terms with the great forces of nature that we cannot control? And, ultimately, can we be truthful and authentic in these imaginary circumstances? Can we trust ourselves enough as artists to play, I mean *really* play with our full self-expression in the face of the uncertainty of this play?

I want to thank all the staff and crew of UTM for all their great support in making this journey. I would also like to thank Ashley Hand for her wonderful and necessary assistance, Joe for his poster design, Peter and Joanne for their wonderful work, Jim and Jen for their inspiring music and technical assistance, David for his hard work and the endless supply of Jujubes and low-complex carbohydrates to keep us moving along at a quick pace and, finally, Patrick Young for giving me the opportunity *to play*.

LADY JOAN LINDSAY – noted Australian author and artist – was born Joan a'Beckett Weigall on November 16, 1896, in St. Kilda East, Victoria, Australia. She was the daughter of Sir Theyre and A.S.H. Weigall. Studying from 1916 to 1920 at the National Gallery School, Melbourne, she started her career as a painter, and first exhibited in 1921 with the Victorian Artists Society. Artistic publications include *Early Melbourne Architecture* and the Australian section of *Masterpieces of the National Gallery of Victoria* – for which she no doubt studied the nineteenth-century painting *Picnic at Hanging Rock.*

In London on Valentine's Day in 1922, she married Sir Daryl Lindsay. Though their life together began very modestly, they soon embarked on global travelling and eventually bought a house in the Australian countryside. This gave Lady Joan a chance to indulge her love for the beauty and danger of nature. According to

her autobiography *Time Without Clocks* (1962), it was at this point that she "switched to writing". Her books include *Through Darkest Ponelayo* (1936), *Facts Soft and Hard* (1964), and a book for children, *Syd Sixpence* (1983).

Picnic at Hanging Rock (1967) became a runaway bestseller in Australia, Britain, and Europe, and enjoyed a new wave of popularity in North America following Peter Weir's breakthrough film version in 1975. Speculation about the authenticity of the events and the cause of the disappearances continued even after a final secret chapter spelling out the answer to the mystery was released following the author's death. The film was re-issued in a director's cut for the Criterion collection in 1997. The novel has never been out of print, and a special edition helps to support the park that maintains Hanging Rock to this day.

Lady Lindsay died in Melbourne on December 23rd, 1984.



LAURA ANNAWYN SHAMAS – essayist, playwright, and consultant – was born in Oklahoma and teaches in the Communication Division at Pepperdine University. She has a Ph.D. in Mythological Studies from Pacifica Graduate Institute. Shamas's first play, *The Other Shakespeare*, was published in 1980. Since then, she has had nineteen plays produced hundreds of times on three continents, has published nine, been included in four anthologies, and won

numerous awards. The three most often seen are Lady-Like, Portrait of a Nude, and her adaptation of Picnic at Hanging Rock.

From there he embarked on a career as a director, producer and actor. Laurence established one of the most successful commercial theatre companies in Canada, Follows-Latimer Productions, which was responsible for opening The New

Yorker Theatre (now named The Panasonic Theatre) on Yonge Street.

Highlights of his professional experience include: launching the Canadian premiere of *Forever Plaid*, which received three Dora Awards including *Outstanding Musical Production*, becoming the longest running mid-sized musical in Toronto history and simultaneously a National Tour; presenting the world renowned production of *STOMP* in Vancouver and Toronto; directing and producing *Closer Than Ever*, which again won the Dora Award for *Outstanding Musical Production* and went on to productions in Vancouver, Victoria and a National Tour; producing *I Love You*, *You're Perfect, Now Change* and *Forever Tango* at the Elgin Theatre in Toronto; directing *Into The Eye Of The Candle* at Tarragon Theatre; directing and producing the new Canadian play *The Originals* at the Gravenhurst Opera House; and fulfilling a life-long dream of directing, producing and acting with his entire family, *Hay Fever*. Most recently Laurence launched and was the artistic director of The Charles W. Stockey Centre -- home of the acclaimed Festival of The Sound -- working with such artists as Cleo Laine, Ashley MacIssac and Stuart McLean and many others.

Laurence has been working as a teacher and acting coach since 1999 and in the Theatre and Drama Studies Program specifically for three years. He loves to teach and share his knowledge of acting and the business with actors. It is his hope that these students will look into the professional world in whatever avenue they chose with commitment, creativity and passion.
