



Lecturer (Term-Limited) British Early Modern Literature

The Department of English and Drama, University of Toronto Mississauga (UTM), invites applications for a one-year term-limited Lecturer position with a specialization in British Early Modern Literature. The appointment will be at the rank of Lecturer and will begin July 1, 2012 and end on June 30, 2013.

Applications are invited from candidates with a PhD in English with a specialization in British Early Modern Literature (dramatic or non-dramatic). Candidates must demonstrate and provide evidence of teaching excellence.

Candidates will be expected to demonstrate experience in teaching first-year introductory courses and literary-historical surveys; familiarity with leading large classes and organizing tutorials will be an asset. The successful applicant will be expected to teach 3.5 full undergraduate courses per year (a 3 and 4 teaching load) and to contribute service to the Department of English and Drama at UTM. Salary commensurate with qualifications and experience.
