Kaneff Centre & Innovation Complex

The Innovation Complex is home to the Institute of Management and Innovation, the departments of Management and Economics and several graduate programs. Additionally, you will find many different instructional spaces, the Office of the Registrar, and the Blackwood Gallery in this building.

William G. Davis Building

This is the largest academic space at the University of Toronto Mississauga, originally built in 1974. You will find many lab spaces for Anthropology, Earth Sciences, Biology, Chemistry, Physics here. This building also houses lecture theatres, classrooms, the Bookstore, a cafeteria, and the Student Services Hub.

Communication, Culture & Technology Building

This building is the home of the Institute of Communication, Culture, Information and Technology. The CC1080 lecture theatre is located here and used for many first-year courses because of its 500-seat capacity students. The CCT building also has many smaller tutorial classrooms and computer labs as well as the MiST Theatre

Hazel McCallion Academic Learning Centre

The UTM Library is the main occupant of the HMLAC, named after Mississauga's longtime former mayor, Hazel McCallion. Many excellent resources are housed here, including reference materials, the Syd Bolton video game archive, a podcast recording room, and the academic learning experts at the Reference & Research Desk.

Instructional Centre

The Instructional Centre houses many lecture halls (including one of the two largest) on campus, lots of study spaces, and a computer lab on the second floor. It has large floor-to-ceiling windows that allow for incredible natural lighting and great views of our campus - you might even spot our beekeeper tending to the apiary located on a rooftop nearby.

Maanjiwe nendamowinan

One of our newest building, Maanjiwe nendamowinan (meaning Gathering of Minds) acknowledges both the Indigenous history of the land and the future of our campus. This building has 6 floors and is equipped with active-learning classrooms. This is also the home of English and Drama, Philosophy, Historical Studies, and others.

Deerfield Hall

Built in 2014, the name of this building comes from the winning submission as part of a naming competition, and inspired by the resident deer on campus. It houses Theatre and Drama Studies, Psychology, and Computer Science, Mathematics and Statistics programs. Next door is the Erindale Studio Theatre.

Student Centre

The Student Centre is the place where students can get together with friends, grab some food, participate in clubs, and much more. The U of T Mississauga Students' Union (UTMSU) is also located in the Student Centre. Also in this building is a multi-faith prayer room, a convenience store, and the campus pub, the Blind Duck.
