The Department of Geography & Planning in the Faculty of Arts & Science at the University of Toronto invites applications for a full-time tenure stream position in the area of Black / Economic Geographies. The appointment will be at the rank of Professor, with an expected start date of July 1, 2021, or shortly thereafter.

Applicants must have earned a PhD degree in Geography or a related area, with a clearly demonstrated exceptional record of excellence in research and teaching. Candidates must demonstrate a considered and long-term engagement with economic geography and Black geographies scholarship, both conceptually and methodologically. Regional specialization is open, but candidates working in the Global South and Black majority regions of the world are especially encouraged to apply. Candidates must have active research agendas focusing on one or more of the following thematic areas: feminist political economy; critical development studies; race, gender and diaspora; underdevelopment; urban governance; relational poverty; work, labour and social reproduction. Lived experience related to Africa or its diaspora will be an asset.

We seek candidates whose research and teaching interests complement and strengthen our existing departmental strengths in economic geography, feminist geography, critical development studies and political economy: <https://geography.utoronto.ca/people/faculty/st-george-undergrad-faculty/>. Candidates will have an established international reputation and will be expected to sustain and lead innovative and independent research at the highest international level, and to maintain an outstanding, competitive, and externally funded research program.

Candidates must provide evidence of research excellence which can be demonstrated by a record of sustained high-impact contributions and publications in top-ranked and field relevant journals, the submitted research statement, presentations at significant conferences, distinguished awards and accolades, and other noteworthy activities that contribute to the visibility and prominence of the discipline, as well as strong endorsements from referees of high standing.

Evidence of excellence in teaching will be provided through teaching accomplishments, the teaching dossier submitted as part of the application including a strong teaching statement, sample course materials and teaching evaluations, as well as strong letters of reference.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.
