The Institute for the Study of University Pedagogy is seeking up to (2) two postdoctoral fellows. These positions will focus on research, combined with teaching four undergraduate courses (two FCEs). Qualified domestic and international applicants are encouraged to apply.

2. Translingualism, Critical Language Awareness & Discourse
3. Artificial Intelligence & Literacy
4. Social Justice & Equity Pedagogy
5. Community Collaborations & Partnerships

**Description of duties:** The successful candidates will conduct research in their field, work collaboratively with ISUP faculty, and contribute to research excellence within the department. The candidates will also teach four undergraduate course (two FCEs).

**Salary:** \$75,000/year plus benefits

**Required qualifications:** The successful candidates must have a recent Ph.D. (within five years) by the time of the appointment in a field related to writing instruction in higher education (e.g., applied linguistics, rhetoric, scholarship of teaching and learning and writing studies). Candidates should show significant promise in research and demonstrate evidence of strength in teaching. The department's research focus areas are listed above and candidates are expected to list one or two potential mentors within ISUP whose interests match the candidate's expertise (see the list of [ISUP Core Faculty](#) members). Experience in teaching writing to undergraduates is an asset.

The cover letter should describe your teaching experience, contributions in pedagogical development, and pedagogical scholarship. Please indicate as part of the cover letter what you envision your contribution to ISUP to be, the faculty members with whom you wish to work, and why you wish to work with them.

All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority if a Canadian candidate or permanent resident and a foreign candidate are otherwise equally qualified.
