U of T Mississauga (UTM) was established in 1967, with one temporary academic building, 155 students, 28 faculty and 40 staff members. Situated on 225 acres of protected greenbelt along the Credit River, the campus has grown to become the second-largest division of U of T, Canada's largest university. UTM now includes 16,000 undergraduate students and 900 graduate students, more than 3,800 full- and part-time employees (including 1,500 appointed faculty, staff and librarians) as well as more than 75,000 alumni.

- UTM offers highly sought-after degree options, such as a bachelor of business administration, as well as several exceptional professional master's degree programs including a master of biomedical communications, a master of biotechnology, a master of management and professional accounting, a master of management of innovation, a master of science in sustainability, a master of forensic accounting, a master of urban innovation and a master of science in occupational therapy.
- UTM has 19 academic units (15 departments and four institutes), 180+ program options and 90 areas of study.
- Notable U of T Mississauga alumni include astronaut Roberta Bondar, filmmaker Richie Mehta, Canadian media executive Kirstine Stewart, fashion designer Lesley Hampton, actor and diplomat Zaib Shaikh, writer/poet Dionne Brand, poet Wali Shah, documentary filmmaker Nisha Pahuja, author and film/television producer Zarqa Nawaz, Olympic gold medallist and communications coach Claire Carver-Dias and Olympians Alicia Brown and Ruslan Gaziev.
- The new science building sets a benchmark as one of the most energy-efficient biological and chemical lab facilities in North America.
- UTM is home to SpinUp, U of T's first wet lab venture incubator which supports early-stage life science companies and entrepreneurs.
- Slated to open in 2026, a new six-storey residence will include 400 beds, bringing the total number of students housed on campus to approximately 1,900.
- The new Student Services Hub in the Davis Building connects students directly with campus experts and makes it easier to get answers and support in one place.
- The Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation office at UTM is complemented by a Tipi and Teaching Lodge and together, they provide space where students, faculty and community can come together for teaching and ceremony.
- The university has established two endowed chairs — one in Jain studies and one in Sikh studies — marking exciting milestones in the growth of the Humanities at UTM. These academic positions will advance teaching, research and community collaboration in areas that explore rich philosophical traditions, cultural histories and lived experiences.
- Launched in 2023, the UTM Anti-Black Racism & Black Inclusion and Excellence Dashboard documents and tracks progress related to UTM's unique, campus-specific response to the U of T Anti-Black Racism Task Force's recommendations and UTM's efforts to promote Black inclusion and excellence.
- UTM is a Gold certified institution under the Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education's (AASHE) [Sustainability Tracking, Assessment, and Rating System](#) (STARS).
