Vision: A Circular economy for a wastefree tomorrow

Mission: Enforce producer responsibility and advocate for the circular economy to spur innovation and protect the environment

RPRA is a regulatory body created by the Government of Ontario. The Authority oversees waste diversion programs until they are wound up and designated under the Resource Recovery and Circular Economy Act, 2016 (RRCEA).

The Tires Regulation is the first regulation under RRCEA, and will wind up December 31, 2018.
