
About the Carbon Pricing Bureau

The Carbon Pricing Bureau is the branch of Environment and Climate Change Canada that is responsible for implementing and operationalizing the Output-Based Pricing System (OBPS)



What is the Output-Based Pricing System?

A federal program designed to retain a price on carbon pollution, and incentivize large industrial emitters to reduce their overall emissions, while maintaining competitiveness and protecting against carbon leakage. Under the OBPS, annual greenhouse gas emissions limits apply to large industrial emitters operating in certain sectors. These emitters will receive credits if their facilities emit below their limit, or will be required to compensate for emissions in excess of their limits
