
SickKids Cycling Group Engagement Supported the cycling group to increase engagement through sharing cycling-related news, biking resources, and updates on bike policy changes.



## SUSTAINABILITY ISSUES AND CHALLENGES

The healthcare industry poses unique challenges when addressing sustainability issues.



Health and safety always comes first —therefore it is challenging to incorporate sustainability while ensuring the health and safety of all individuals

Separating biohazardous waste from hazardous waste: improper sorting can lead to contamination from biohazardous waste

• **Source Reduction**: many medical supplies (ie. Surgical masks, kidney basins, surgical drapes) are disposable rather than reusable, therefore there has to be a delicate balance between safety, protecting the environment, and financial sustainability

## KEY TAKEAWAYS



Coordination between different departments is integral in communicating proper disposal rules and waste reduction efforts through out the hospital.



Increasing accessibility to different streams of waste bins will make it easier for individuals to properly sort and divert waste away from the landfill.
