## • International Component Tagging

**INTL-R:** The international component (trip) is canonical to the course and MUST run every time the course is offered. Every student enrolled in the course must attend the trip.

Assessments in the course may or may not involve evaluation of academic performance during the trip and/ or submission of academic work directly related to content/ experiences from the trip.

**INTL-O:** The international component (trip) is canonical to the course but does not need to run every time the course is offered. When offered, attendance on the trip is optional for students. Assessments in the course cannot require participation on the trip and/ or content covered during the trip unless equivalent alternative assessments are available to those not on the trip.
