## Step 3: Program Search for New Students

Follow the steps 1-4 below, and click submit:

1. Program Search: type “**Mississauga**” to help narrow down the results.
2. Month your program starts: select “September”.
3. Year of the program you’re entering: select “1” to indicate your first year of study
4. Level of Study: select “Bachelor’s degree” then click submit.
5. When you proceed to the next screen: Choose “Bachelor of Arts/Science (Mississauga: Erindale)”

## Step 3: Program Search for Returning Students

As a returning student, type “**Mississauga**” in the program search field.

From the results, select your program and year of study from the options that appear.

### Note:


If you're in a non-deregulated fee program, select “**Bachelor of Arts/Science (Mississauga: Erindale)**” with the corresponding Year of Study.

If you have completed 4.0 credits, and have been admitted to a program of study with deregulated program fees, select one of the following programs:

- Computer Science  
NOTE: *Bioinformatics, CCIT, DEM and VCC students should select Computer Science. These programs have been grouped together for OSAP because they share the same tuition costs.*
- Commerce
- Management

### What percentage of a full course load will you be taking?

For example, if a full course load is 5 courses and you are taking 5, then you'd be taking 100%.

## Step 4: Declare Your Course Load

Your course load information is entered as a percentage based on the number of credits you enrolled in (do not include waitlisted or courses that have an INVIT status). See the chart below:

Course Load %	Fall-Winter Credits	Credits Per Term
100%	5.0	2.5
80%	4.0	2.0
60%	3.0	1.5
40%	2.0	1.0
20%	1.0	0.5

### What does it mean to be a full-time OSAP student?

- ✓ You are enrolled in at least a 60% course load (minimum 1.5 credits each term).
- ✓ If you have a permanent disability, you are eligible to receive full-time OSAP assistance with a reduced course load of at least 40% (minimum 1.0 credit in each term). Contact your physician or regulated health care professional to request completion of the [OSAP Disability Verification Form](#), which can be found on the OSAP website.

If your course load changes, you can notify the university, and OSAP by using the [Financial Aid Change Form](#) on the Office of the Registrar website. Upload the completed document to your OSAP application.

## Tips & Next Steps

### Submit Required Documents

- If you have required documentation to submit (e.g. Consent, Declaration and Signature pages), upload them directly to your OSAP application. Returning students may not need to submit any documentation.
- Complete your Master Student Financial Assistance Agreement (MSFAA) by following the steps online. You are only required to complete the MSFAA once during your postsecondary studies.

### Check your OSAP status online

- Monitor the status of your OSAP application regularly online.
- OSAP estimates will be available later this summer, while processing may take up to 6-8 weeks.

### NEW for 2020-21

- Students who do not wish to identify or disclose their gender may now select an “Other” option when completing the profile section of the application.

### Request a fee deferral to register for the upcoming year
